AB - Examines the relationship between women's maternal, caregiving role & their level of environmental concern, drawing on data from 1,557 respondents to the 1993 General Social Survey. Findings indicate that women show more concern about environmental issues & animal rights than do men, but are no more likely to engage in environmental action. Childrearing has no consistent effects on environmental concern among either women or men, while those with higher levels of education, social status, knowledge, & trust in science are more likely to engage in proenvironmental action. 4 Tables, 47 References.
